■ ■ ■ Purpose

The missionary outreach of the Brethren movement has been remarkable. There are now churches linked to it in at least 130 countries. There are over 20,000 congregations with over 2m Sunday attenders, and maybe more.

But often Brethren churches in one country have little contact with those in other countries - and even between themselves within a country. In some countries, the number of churches is small; in others, large. Some groups are growing rapidly; some are stagnant or declining. Countries which received foreign missionaries are now sending workers abroad themselves. All this means that it's good for Brethren leaders from the different countries to meet regularly for fellowship, prayer, spiritual reflection, renewed experience of the Lord, networking, exchange of information, discussion of common questions - above all, for mutual encouragement. IBCM conferences provide the opportunity.

So, join us in France on 13 - 17 June 2011!

■ ■ ■ Objectives

- To seek the presence and direction of the Lord together
- To enable leaders from across the world to discover and encourage each other
- To strengthen networking, fellowship and prayer
- To raise awareness of the spiritual challenges of current trends and cultural developments
- To share practical experience, ideas and methods
- To encourage younger leaders
- To encourage the development of regional conferences with similar objectives

Earlier IBCM conferences have stimulated new action and developments in a wide range of places across the world.

'Mission' in 'IBCM' refers to the whole task of the Church everywhere. We want to encourage churches to be 'missional' in the widest sense.

Our goal is that at least 90 countries should be represented at IBCM5, and we would be very happy to exceed that number.

The conference is for both men and women. In particular, please encourage and help younger leaders to come to the conference.

■ ■ ■ Conference theme

Under the title of 'I will build my church' (Mt. 16: 18), we plan to focus on growing the church in the many different settings, cultures, groups and generations which face us, and on what this means for the structure, practices and methods of our churches in different parts of the world.

■ ■ ■ Location

The IBCM International Planning Group is very happy that the IBCM5 conference has been invited to France by the **Commission de Référence et de Service of the Communautés et Assemblées Evangéliques de France** (CAEF - the body that unites about 100 assemblies in France).

The conference is to be held at Strasbourg, an ancient city on the Franco-German border which was important in the Reformation and is now the seat of the Parliament of the European Union. Conference sessions and main meals will be in the EPIS church buildings and overnight accommodation in the CIARUS or St-Thomas hotels or with a family.

Strasbourg is accessible from the international airports at Paris and Frankfurt (Germany) as well as other international hub airports in Europe. There are European air services to Strasbourg, Basle-Mulhouse and Karlsruhe-Baden. Strasbourg is well served by rail and motorways.

For me, one of the greatest joys is to catch a glimpse of what God is doing in various parts of the world and the opportunity to get to know brothers and sisters serving under various conditions. IBCM4 participant

■ ■ ■ Entry Visas

Citizens of European Union and European Economic Area countries, and of a considerable number of other countries (including at present the USA, Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Malaysia, Singapore and some Central and South American countries) do not have to get a visa in advance to visit France. To check whether you need to get a visa in advance, visit http://www.diplomatie.gouv.fr/en/espaces_dedies.php3?id_rubrique=2045

Those who need to get a visa in advance will need to apply themselves in very good time to the French diplomatic post in the country where they live. The visa application will need to be accompanied by an official letter of invitation to the conference, which will be issued by the CAEF. If you need to get a visa in advance, you must request the official letter of invitation on the booking form. You should not initiate your visa application until you have received the official letter of invitation. The decision whether to grant a visa is entirely a matter for the diplomatic post to which the application is made.

The cost of the visa will fall to the applicant.

■ ■ ■ Conference fees

* This fee also applies to accommodation with a local family.

** Includes lunch and evening meal, access to sessions and workshops, and conference pack.

*** Those who wish to make their own hotel arrangements may do so and pay this conference fee; a list of hotels will be available on the websites at www.ibcm.net and www.caef.net.

These fees include charges for use of conference facilities, equipment, translation costs, administration, main speakers' expenses, etc. The full fee includes an amount for the short daily tram trips between the hotel and the conference centre. The fees exclude all travel costs to and from the conference, which will fall to participants themselves, including those to and from airports. The fees are for the period from the evening meal on Monday 13 June to the afternoon of Friday 17 June. Accommodation can be available for nights before and after the conference by prior arrangement only at a cost of about €50 per person per day, including meals. Day visitors should still complete and submit the booking form.

No booking can be made without submitting a completed booking form.

■ ■ ■ Conference languages

We plan simultaneous translation with headphone between: English, French, Spanish, and German. Informal arrangements for translation into other languages will be made, as practicable and necessary.

■ ■ ■ Travel to and from France and airport-Strasbourg transfer

Conference participants are responsible for arranging and paying for their transport to and from France, and from the point of arrival in Europe to Strasbourg and return, and for meeting all costs associated with travel, including food and accommodation en route.

■ ■ ■ Bookings and payment

All participants are strongly advised to arrange travel and medical insurance for themselves for the period that they will be outside their own country. Those who need to get a visa in advance will be required to provide evidence of medical, travel and repatriation insurance before a visa will be issued to them.

■ ■ ■ Assistance with costs

The IBCM International Planning Group recognises that participants from some countries (particularly in Africa and parts of Asia) may need financial assistance with conference fees and travel costs. Such assistance will only be given if essential to enable the participant to attend. Normally, only one person per country will be assisted, and assisted participants will be expected to make at least some financial contribution themselves.
